All Delhi Schedule Caste Nursing Officers Association is organizing a historic state-level mega meeting today from 2:00 PM to 5:00 PM at The Indian Society of Law, New Delhi.

Facts:

- Event: State Level Maha Baithak (All Delhi SC Nursing Officers) Time / Venue: 5th September, 2 PM to 5 PM, The Indian Society of Law, New Delhi Organizer: All Delhi Schedule Caste Nursing Officers Association
- Participation: Hundreds of SC Nursing Officers and office bearers from all 22 major Delhi Govt hospitals including LNJP, GTB, DDU, BSA, Deep Chand Bandhu Hospital, Chacha Nehru Bal Chikitsalaya etc. Meeting led by President of association.
- Objective: To give steel-strong unity to organization at Delhi level, prepare future strategy and submit comprehensive demand letter (memorandum) to Ministry of Health and Delhi Secretariat. All decisions to be sent in writing to all hospitals.

Full Details of Demands:

- A) Promotion Related:
- Immediate promotions pending for years in Nursing Cadre.
 - Stop practice of Officiating / Acting posts in all Delhi hospitals and fill posts through proper channel promotion.
 - Promotion hierarchy to be fixed - first Chief Nursing Officer (CNO), then Nursing Superintendent (NS), Deputy Nursing Superintendent (DNS), Assistant Nursing Superintendent (ANS) and finally Senior Nursing Officer (SNO).

- B) Backlog and Grade Pay:
- Immediately fill vacant backlog posts of SC category.
 - Grade Pay of Assistant Nursing Superintendent be revised from 5400A or 5400B to 6600.
 - Qualification Allowance be given to eligible Nursing Officers.C) Workplace Dignity:
 - Ensure safety and dignified, discrimination-free environment at workplace.

Analysis - Why This Meeting is Important: Thousands of Nursing Officers work in Delhi's 22 govt hospitals, with large number from SC community. Non-promotion not only causes career stagnation but also leadership vacuum in hospital administration. Non-filling of backlog posts defeats purpose of reservation policy. Demand for Grade Pay 6600 is linked to removal of anomaly of 7th Pay Commission.

The Delhi Taxi & Tourist Transporters Association today met Hon'ble Delhi Tourism & Law Minister Shri Kapil Mishra and submitted a memorandum opposing the proposed restrictions on BS-IV diesel taxis and tourist buses in Delhi-NCR.

BS-IV Diesel Vehicle Ban Threatens Livelihoods of Lakhs: Delhi Transporters Warn of Major Protest

Association President Shri Sanjay Samrat said that thousands of transporters had invested their life savings and taken bank loans to purchase their

vehicles. Many buses were registered in Gurugram and other NCR areas because diesel bus registrations were restricted in Delhi.

"Our vehicles remained idle for nearly two years during COVID-19, but we continued paying EMIs, insurance, permits and other expenses. Now, when the tourism sector is recovering, prematurely stopping BS-IV vehicles will push thousands of families into another financial crisis."

CAQM Must Consider Livelihoods Along with Pollution Control The Association said it supports pollution-control measures but strongly opposes any policy that shuts down vehicles without providing a practical transition period or alternative arrangements. The Association has demanded that BS-IV vehicles be allowed to operate for their full permissible age/life, instead of being forced off the road prematurely.

Serious Questions Over Panic Button/VLTD System The Association also raised serious concerns about the Panic Button/VLTD system, alleging that the system is not functioning effectively in many vehicles despite significant expenditure and compliance costs imposed on transporters.

The Association has demanded an independent, high-level investigation into the system, including expenditure, contracts, equipment quality, functionality and accountability.

Minister Kapil Mishra Assures Action Minister Shri Kapil Mishra heard the delegation's concerns and, according to the Association, assured them of necessary discussions with senior officials of the Delhi

Transport Department and CAQM. Major Jantar Mantar Protest if Demands Are Ignored

Shri Sanjay Samrat warned that if the legitimate demands of transporters are not addressed promptly, the Association will organise a major peaceful and democratic protest at Jantar Mantar against CAQM and the concerned authorities.

"We are not against the government and we are not against pollution control. We are against policies that destroy the livelihoods of transporters and drivers without providing practical alternatives.

This is not merely a transport issue—it is a livelihood issue affecting lakhs of families."

Promises vs Reality, 15-Day Inspection Still Awaited After 3 Months

Despite MP Manoj Tiwari's assurance, Burari main road condition worsens, residents ask - Where should public go?

In Burari Assembly constituency under North East Delhi Lok Sabha seat, public anger is

growing over roads and basic amenities. Residents allege that assurances of inspection and construction by public representatives have not been fulfilled on time.

Facts:

- What was promised: According to local residents, in May 2026 BJP MP Shri Manoj Tiwari had said to Burari residents that within 15 days he would conduct a joint inspection of Burari with Chief Minister Smt. Rekha Gupta and that tender process for Burari main road construction has been completed.
- What is ground reality: After more than 3 months, locals say neither joint inspection with CM has taken place nor any comprehensive inspection by MP himself has been visible regarding Burari's dilapidated condition. During this period, condition of Burari main road has deteriorated further instead of improving, leading to daily commuting problems, waterlogging and dust pollution.
- Core public question: With alleged false

promises by regional MP and lack of attention by AAP MLA and concerned departments, is solution possible? What should public do and where should they go?

Key Points - Public Interest Analysis:

A) Issue is of coordination, not just administration: Burari main road falls under jurisdiction of PWD / MCD / DDA. Without coordination of MP LAD recommendation, MLA LAD proposal and execution by Delhi Govt PWD, road construction is not possible. Completion of tender is only paper process, work order and ground implementation is real test.

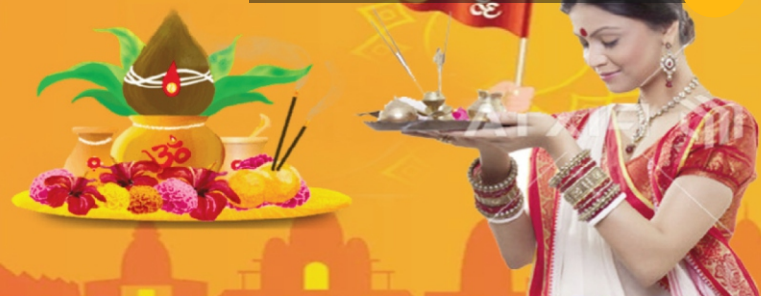
B) Legal rights of citizens: Under Article 21 of Constitution, right to dignified life includes right to clean environment and movement. As per Delhi Municipal Corporation Act and PWD Manual, maintenance of main roads is mandatory responsibility of concerned agency. Citizens have right to file RTI, attend Jan Sunwai and lodge complaint on CPGRAMS / PGMS portal.

C) What should be the solution:

- MP office should make public tender number, name of agency and date of commencement of work.
- PWD should carry out temporary pothole filling and immediate drainage solution on Burari main road.
- Joint inspection by CM, MP and local MLA should be done and a time-bound roadmap be issued.D) What can public do: In democracy, asking questions is a right. Residents through RWAs can submit written memorandum to LG Office, PWD

Eligible youth should fill Form 6 and get their names registered in the voter list: DC

Do not pay heed to rumours regarding SIR; the review process is being carried out with complete transparency and under the prescribed rules.

If the name is missing or there is an error in any details, fill Form-8 by September 30.

Proof of eligibility may be submitted along with required documents as per year of birth

Jhajjar, September 5 .

DC and District Election Officer Varsha Khanwal stated that ensuring the inclusion of every eligible citizen in the district in the final voter list under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) is a top priority for the district administration. She appealed to eligible citizens to check their names in the preliminary voter list. If a name is missing from

the list or there is an error in the name, address, or other details, they should complete and submit the relevant form within the stipulated time limit.

Eligible voters need not worry. The DC clarified that the entire SIR process is being conducted under established rules and a transparent system, in accordance with the directives of the Election Commission of India. An eligible citizen's name cannot be removed from the voter list simply because old voter records or relevant documents are unavailable. The removal of an eligible voter's name can only be done following the established procedures and after proper investigation.

Form-6 for name addition, Form-8 for amendments

DC Varsha Khanwal stated that eligible citizens whose names are not included in the voter list can

apply to have their names registered by filling out Form 6. Form 8 can be used to amend the name, address, or other details listed on the voter list. Both forms can be submitted to the relevant Electoral Registration Officer or Booth Level Officer by September 30, 2026. He explained that a declaration must be submitted along with the application for enrollment or transfer. This will include the details of the individual, their parents, or grandparents, if available, from the previous special intensive revision of the voter list.

Documents required may vary depending on the year of birth

The DC informed that eligible citizens who do not have the record of previous voter list can submit proof of eligibility through prescribed documents as per their year of birth.

He stated that individuals born before July 1, 1987, can prove their

eligibility by using any acceptable document included in the indicative list. Individuals born between July 1, 1987, and December 2, 2004, must submit their own documents and those of one of their parents. Similarly, individuals born after December 2, 2004, must submit the necessary documents for themselves, their father, and their mother. If the parents are not Indian citizens, a copy of their valid visa and passport at the time of birth must also be submitted.

Documents related to identity, birth and residence can be valid

District Election Officer Varsha Khanwal said that the indicative list for eligibility proof includes identity card issued by the government or local authority, pension payment order, birth certificate, passport, matriculation or educational certificate issued by a recognized board or university, permanent residence certificate, forest rights

certificate, caste certificate, family register and land or house allotment certificate issued by the government, among other documents.

Stay away from misleading information, get correct information on 1950. District Election Officer Varsha Khanwal appealed to citizens not to believe any rumors or misleading information circulating on social media or other sources regarding the SIR process. In case of any problems or concerns regarding the voter list or documents, information and guidance can be obtained from the office of the relevant Booth Level Officer, Electoral Registration Officer, or Assistant Electoral Registration Officer. Additionally, the voter helpline number 1950 can also be contacted.

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Today's Cybersecurity Thought

Clicking on a pornographic ad on Facebook or Instagram can trigger a chain of cyber fraud because attackers use malicious Android apps disguised as porn apps to hijack your device, steal sensitive data, and execute unauthorized financial transactions.

The Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) and its National Cybercrime Threat Analytics Unit (NCTAU) have warned that these scams are spreading rapidly in India, with apps like "Night Play," "ReLoop," "Kyss," "Vimo," "Rivo," "Nexo," and "Vixa" being promoted through Meta-owned platforms. Mechanism of this Fraud

1. Distribution via Ads Fraudulent ads on Facebook and Instagram promote pornographic content.
 - o Clicking redirects users to phishing websites (often with "live" domains).
2. Malicious APK Download Users are persuaded to download apps outside the Google Play Store. These APKs masquerade as porn apps but contain malware.
3. Secondary Package Installation Once installed, the app downloads a hidden "update" package.
 - o This package abuses permissions to gain deeper control.
4. Abuse of Accessibility Permissions
 - o The app requests Accessibility Services permissions.
 - o Once granted, attackers can take over the device, monitor activity, and

- block uninstallation.
- 5. VPN Installation Some apps install a malicious VPN to route traffic through attacker-controlled servers.
 - o This allows interception of banking data, OTPs, and personal information.
- 6. Financial Fraud Execution Malware runs in the background, enabling unauthorized UPI/bank transactions.
 - o Victims often discover money drained without their knowledge. Risks to Citizens
 - Device takeover: Complete control of phone functions.
 - Data theft: Contacts, SMS, keystrokes, and banking credentials harvested.
 - Financial loss: Unauthorized UPI transfers, card misuse, or wallet draining.
 - Persistence: Malware may block uninstallation or disguise itself as system apps. Counter-Actions & Safety Measures
 - Install apps only from trusted sources (Google Play Store, Apple App Store).
 - Never download APKs from ads, porn sites, or unknown links.
 - Do not grant Accessibility permissions to unfamiliar apps.
 - Enable Google Play Protect and keep your device updated.
 - Regularly check bank/UPI transactions

- for suspicious activity.
- Uninstall suspicious apps in Safe Mode; remove related unknown apps.
- Report incidents immediately to the 1930 cyber helpline or the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (cybercrime.gov.in).

Clicking on such ads is not just about viewing explicit content—it's a gateway to device hijacking and financial fraud. The safest countermeasure is to avoid side loaded APKs entirely and report suspicious ads or apps to authorities.

Rourkela, September 5. On the occasion of Janmashtami—the birth anniversary of Lord Krishna—Rourkela city was

immersed in an atmosphere of devotion, faith, and jubilation from Friday evening through midnight. Devotees worshipped Lord Krishna with full reverence and according to traditional rituals across the city's temples, 'Gokul' setups, religious sites, and homes. As midnight approached, the crowds of devotees swelled, and the air resonated with chants of "Nand ke Anand Bhayo, Jai Kanhaiya Lal Ki" (Joy to Nanda, Hail Kanhaiya Lal). Great enthusiasm was also evident among the children. Little ones were seen in attractive costumes, dressed as Radha, Krishna, and Balarama. Special tableaux, 'Bal-Gopal' (child Krishna) fancy-dress displays, and cultural programs organized for children at various locations captivated everyone's hearts. This is why a special worship ceremony marking Krishna's birth is performed at midnight on Janmashtami.

Musa-Pusi Mining: Not Just About Deforestation; Supply of Illegal Explosives Raises Serious Questions

Amidst tree felling, threats to wildlife habitats, and pollution, the most critical question remains: where did explosives on such a massive scale come from, and who supplied them?

Rourkela/Sundargarh. The alleged illegal mining in the Musa-Pusi area is no longer limited to just hill excavation, tree felling, or the loss of government revenue. If explosives were used for large-scale mining here, the most serious questions arise: who provided such a vast quantity of explosives? Were they supplied from outside the district or procured locally? And why did the local administrative machinery, responsible for overseeing such activities, fail to detect it?

This issue is particularly serious because the use of explosives in legitimate mining projects is subject to strict regulations. Official environmental documents mandate the disclosure of approved systems and permits regarding the storage, transportation, and use of explosives in mining operations.

The fact that large-scale mining activities continued for an extended period despite opposition from villagers raises questions about the effectiveness of administrative oversight. Under whose patronage or negligence did this activity escalate to such a scale? Who provided the machinery, crushers, labor, transport, and explosives? Answers to these questions must be uncovered through an investigation.

The severity of the environmental damage cannot be underestimated either. According to central forest and environmental documents, mining can lead to the loss of trees and vegetation, fragmentation of wildlife habitats, dust and noise pollution, water pollution, soil erosion, and increased human-wildlife conflict. Noise generated by explosions and heavy machinery can also disrupt wildlife behavior, breeding patterns, and movement.

Serious cases regarding the environmental impact of illegal

mining have surfaced in Odisha in the past as well. Following the exposure of large-scale illegal coal mining in the forests of Sundargarh's Hemgir region in 2025, the administration had even conducted drone mapping of the affected area. Similarly, in the Nishchinta Hill case, it was revealed before the NGT that over 20,000 tonnes of stone had been extracted using explosives and heavy machinery, all without the requisite environmental clearance or blasting licenses.

In this context, dismissing the Musa-Pusi incident merely as a case of "illegal mining" would be insufficient. There is a need for an impartial investigation into the entire mining chain—determining who held the mining permit (if any) and at what level it was granted; who owned the machinery; where the extracted mineral was sent; who handled the transportation; and who supplied the explosives. If the explosives were indeed sourced from outside the district, investigating that supply chain could prove to be the most crucial link in unraveling the entire affair.

This is not merely a matter concerning hills and stones; it is a serious issue linked to forests, wildlife, water, air, the safety of villagers, law and order, and—ultimately—the future of all involved.

The licenses of 13 more agricultural service centers in Nashik district have been suspended.

Nashik: In view of the Kharif season, the Agriculture Department has intensified its inspection campaign to ensure farmers receive quality agricultural inputs. Following inspections, the licenses of 13 more agricultural service centers in the district have been suspended for violations. With this, the number of licenses suspended since April 9, 2026, has reached 154, according to District Agriculture Superintendent Ravindra Mane. As part of the planning for the 2026 Kharif season, agricultural service centers are being inspected to ensure the sale of high-quality seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides. Notices were issued to the concerned individuals and hearings were held for any irregularities found during the inspections. Subsequently, action was taken to suspend the licenses of centers found to be in violation.



The inspection revealed irregularities such as the e-POS machine, rate board, and stock board not being up-to-date, improper record maintenance, stock register failure, and failure to issue receipts to farmers. These irregularities cast doubt on the sales process of agricultural inputs. Of the 154

suspended licenses, 108 are for fertilizers, 26 for seeds, and 20 for pesticides. Furthermore, 52 licenses have been permanently cancelled so far. The Agriculture Department has appealed to farmers to purchase seeds and fertilizers only from authorized agricultural service centers and to obtain a valid bill.

Forcibly extorted ₹48 lakh in interest on a ₹20 lakh loan

Nashik: It is alleged that even after paying exorbitant interest of ₹48 lakh on a ₹20 lakh loan, the medical professional was asked for another ₹50 lakh. It is alleged that he was called to a hotel, beaten, kidnapped, and held for approximately four hours in an Amritdham office to enter into a development agreement for the plot.

Furthermore, the complaint claims that he was threatened with an atrocity case if he did not hand over the plot.

A case has been registered against Saddam Sheikh and Lata Barde at the Panchavati police station, and the investigation is ongoing. Notably, it has been learned that two days ago, a case was also registered against the same suspects at the Adgaon police station for demanding a ransom of ₹5 crore. For extortion in Nashik, Vaibhav Devre, a resident of the Indiranagar (Chetnagar) area of Nashik and a former office bearer of a political party, was arrested a few days ago. He faces serious charges of threatening, extorting, and defrauding people in Nashik by lending them money on interest, extorting money, and charging exorbitant interest rates. Following a surge in complaints in this case, the Indiranagar police



arrested Vaibhav Devre. Approximately 15 cases were filed against him in the Indiranagar, Ambad, and Gangapur police stations. Because the crime was serious, the dashing police officer, Mr. Ashok Sharma, initiated action against Vaibhav Devre, his wife Sonal Devre, and their gang under the Maharashtra Control of Organized Crime Act (MCOCA) through the Police Commissioner's Office. Many such fraudsters are forcibly extorting money and taking over people's farms,

plots, shops, vehicles, and gold in their own names. Now, the people of Nashik want the Nashik Police Commissioner to end illegal money laundering and provide justice to the victims. Strictest action should be taken against all illegal money launderers. It remains to be seen whether the Nashik Police will invoke MCOCA action in this case as well.

As per the allegations made in the complaint, the police are further investigating the matter.

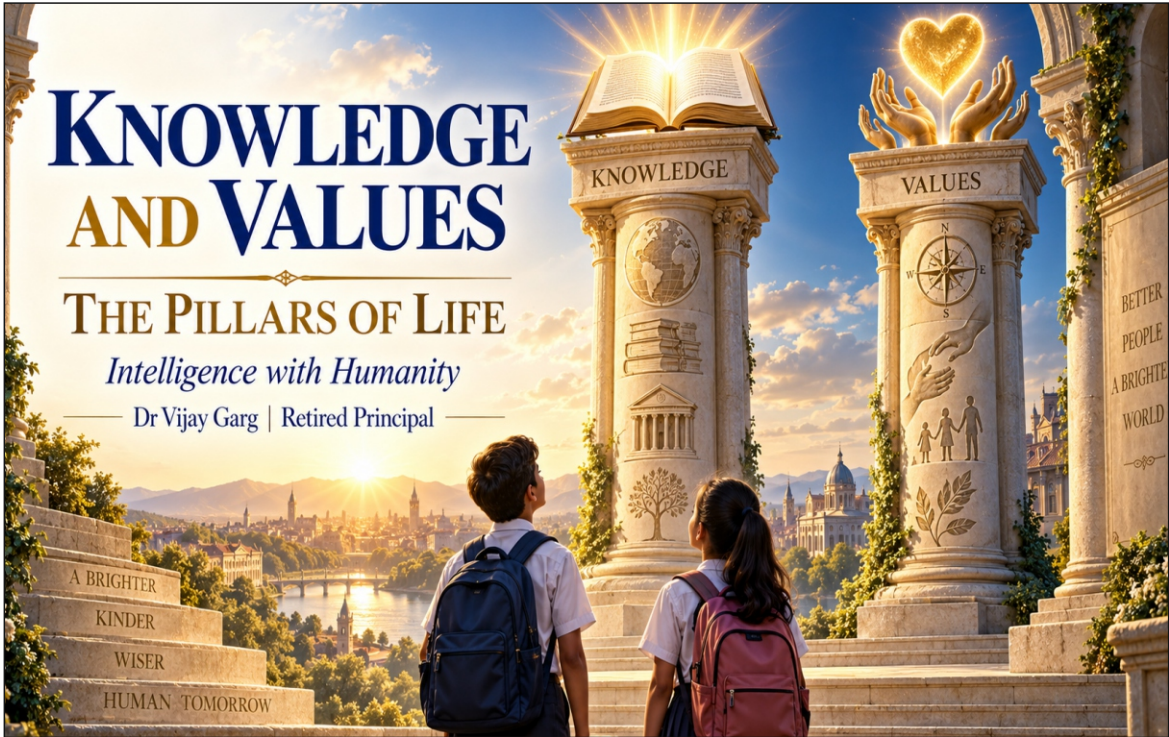
Knowledge develops the intellect, while values shape character.

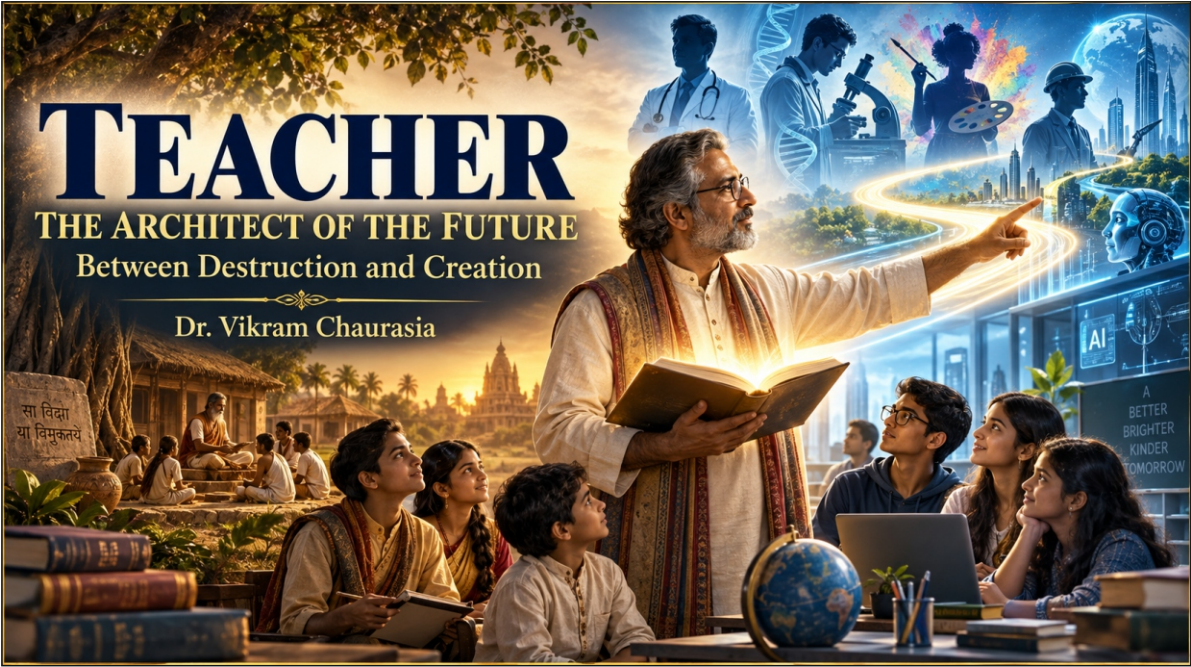
In the race to understand the universe, we should not forget the universe within ourselves.

He emphasized that prioritizing health is crucial during the changing weather and the post-monsoon humidity, as increased moisture in the air fosters the rapid proliferation of bacteria and viruses. During this season, it is essential to pay special attention to the digestive system, immunity, and personal hygiene. To keep yourself and your family healthy in line with the season, make sure to follow key guidelines—such as focusing on dietary habits and consuming fresh, hot food—as part of the 'Health Awareness Campaign.' Always eat freshly cooked, hot, homemade food. Avoid consuming food that has been left out in the open for long periods, as it carries a high risk of bacterial contamination. Completely avoid street snacks like chaat and pakoras, as well as pre-cut fruits and salads sold in the open. During this season, contaminated water and food can lead to illnesses such as typhoid, jaundice, and food poisoning. Opt for light and easily digestible food; the body's digestive fire tends to slow down slightly during the monsoon and humid weather. Ensure water purity and proper hydration—always drink clean water or water that has been boiled and cooled. Even if the weather feels cool or humid, do not let your body become dehydrated. Make sure to drink 8–10 glasses of water throughout the day to flush out toxins from the body. Avoid drinking water that is excessively cold (straight from the fridge). To boost your immunity, include ingredients like ginger, holy basil (Tulsi), Giloy, and turmeric in your diet. These home remedies help protect you against seasonal flu, colds, and coughs. Consume seasonal fruits like lemons, oranges, and amla (Indian gooseberry) to strengthen your immunity. Regarding hygiene and protection: wash your hands thoroughly with soap for at

least 15–20 seconds before cooking or eating, and after returning from outside. Do not allow water to stagnate around the house, or in coolers or flower pots. To protect yourself from dengue and malaria, wear full-sleeved clothing and use mosquito nets or mosquito repellents. Maintain an active routine and get adequate rest; engage in light exercise and yoga—such as yoga asanas, Kapalbhathi, or Pranayama—indoors to ward off lethargy and keep your metabolism healthy. Adequate Sleep: Getting 7 to 8 hours of good sleep is essential for the body to recover and stay protected against illnesses. Sudden fluctuations in temperature activate viruses, making issues like sore throat, cough, and fever common. Changes in humidity and temperature exacerbate respiratory issues such as asthma, bronchitis, and allergies. Impact on the digestive system: Seasonal changes can weaken digestive power, leading to complaints of indigestion, gas, and stomach infections ! Migraines and headaches can be triggered by changes in atmospheric pressure and temperature. Stagnant water during the rainy season allows mosquitoes to breed, thereby increasing the risk of dengue and malaria. Consume Giloy or Tulsi to boost immunity. India's New Global Economic Leap: The Decisive Road to 2047 Through Capital, Space, Forex and BRICS

From a Market to the Centre of Global Power

In today's world, a nation's economic power is no longer judged merely by its GDP, stock indices, or foreign exchange reserves. True power is determined by its ability to attract global capital, secure its supply chains, achieve self-reliance in technology and strategic sectors, and make its voice influential in a changing world order.From this perspective, the year 2026 appears extremely crucial for India. Economic Diplomacy: Finance Minister's North America Visit and G20Fact: As per the official schedule, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman was on a visit to Canada and the USA from 25th August to 2nd September 2026. She met investors, companies and financial sector representatives in Chicago, Asheville and New York. Leading the Indian delegation at the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors meeting held in Asheville on 31st August and 1st September holds special significance.Analysis: This is not just diplomacy. At a time when trade tensions, energy prices, debt crises and geopolitical conflicts have increased uncertainty for global investors, India is projecting itself as a destination for long-term investment, production and technological expansion. India no longer wants to be a country that merely reacts to global economic crises, but one that shapes global economic rules, financial stability and the direction of growth.Impact on Stock Market: Before investing, Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) look at growth, currency stability, forex reserves, fiscal health, policy stability and corporate potential. This outreach strengthens confidence for long-term FII inflows. However, this does not mean the market will only go up. Global interest rates, US bond yields, crude oil prices and trade policies will continue to cause volatility. Risk management remains as important as the growth story.2. The Financial Shield: Record \$740 Billion Forex ReserveFact: In the week ending 28th August 2026, India's foreign exchange reserves rose by \$11.475 billion to a record high of \$740.803 billion. Of this, Foreign Currency Assets were around \$600.67 billion and Gold Reserves were around \$116.41 billion.Analysis: This is not just a number; it is a protective shield. In case of a strong dollar, sudden capital outflows, or a spike in oil prices, a large reserve gives the Reserve Bank of India the ability to intervene in an orderly manner and control excessive volatility in the Rupee. This boosts confidence of both domestic and international investors about India's external financial stability.Caution: A high forex reserve by

itself does not permanently strengthen the Rupee. Factors like crude oil imports, global demand for the US dollar, interest rate differentials and capital flows determine the Rupee's direction. The record reserve should be seen as a sign of financial strength, not a guarantee of a rally in currency or equities.3. Space Power: EOS-05 and the New Space EconomyFact: According to ISRO, GSLV-F17 placed EOS-05 into a Sub-Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit. EOS-05 is India's first imaging satellite designed for earth observation from a geosynchronous orbit, at an altitude of about 36,000 km.Analysis: The importance of earth observation capability from the geosynchronous belt is not limited to military surveillance. It can be used for weather forecasting, disaster management, agriculture, environmental monitoring and broader national security requirements. Space technology is now becoming a part of India's economy.This opens a new sector for international investment. If India enhances its capability in earth observation, communication, navigation, launch services, satellite data and space-based services, it will create new markets for private space companies, defence-tech, electronics, semiconductors, sensors, software and data analytics firms. In the Indian stock market, not only traditional banking, IT or auto companies, but also space-tech and deep-tech linked companies can become part of the future investment story.Strategically, the nature of warfare is changing. Future conflicts will see a growing role of space and cyber domains along with land, sea and air. The competition between the US and China in space capability, satellite networks and earth surveillance is a sign of this shift. For India, the challenge is to develop space not just as a scientific achievement but as economic, strategic and national security infrastructure.4. Global Leadership: 18th BRICS Summit in New DelhiFact: India is chairing BRICS in 2026. The 18th BRICS Summit will be held in New Delhi on 12th and 13th September 2026. The theme is 'Building for Resilience, Innovation, Cooperation & Sustainability - BRICS'. More than 350 meetings and high-level events have already been organized in over 25 cities throughout the year.Analysis: It would be wrong to limit the comparison between BRICS and G7 to a simplistic 'who won, who lost' question. G7 has immense influence in developed economies, global financial institutions, technology companies and capital markets, while the importance of BRICS is linked to emerging economies, energy, natural resources, large consumer markets and the voice of the Global South. Both groups have strength in different areas. The real change is that the world economy is moving from a unipolar framework to a more multipolar system.For India, this is both a challenge and an exceptional opportunity. The New Delhi summit will give India an opportunity to present itself as a bridge between the Global South and developed economies. If India pushes practical initiatives on trade, digital payments, trade in local currencies, energy security, critical minerals, development finance, artificial intelligence and supply chain cooperation, Indian companies will benefit. New markets can open up for Indian banks, digital payment companies, infrastructure, energy, pharma, automobile, IT and manufacturing sectors.The Combined Picture: Vision 2047 QuadrilateralThe combined psychological and

real impact of all these events on the Indian stock market can be significant. Strong forex reserves give confidence against external shocks; global economic diplomacy can increase the confidence of foreign investors; space and defence technology can create new industrial opportunities; while India's activism in BRICS and G20 can open doors to new global markets for Indian companies.For international investors, India's biggest strength will no longer be just fast GDP growth. They will see multiple stories in India at once — a large consumer market, Digital Public Infrastructure, manufacturing capacity, energy transition, space technology, defence production, financial depth, startup ecosystem and growing economic ties with the Global South.Conclusion: The Final LeapFrom the perspective of Vision 2047, these events are most significant. A Viksit Bharat will be built only when India becomes not just economically large, but also financially strong, technologically self-reliant, strategically secure and globally influential.India's record forex reserve strengthens its financial shield; the space mission demonstrates its technological power; economic diplomacy in the G20 strengthens its voice in global policy-making; and BRICS gives it a platform for leadership in a changing multipolar world order. Seen together, the economic blueprint of Vision 2047 becomes clearer.The opportunity before India is huge, but it would be the biggest mistake to consider it an automatic achievement. In the global economy today, capital flows to countries where, along with growth potential, policy credibility, institutional strength and future technological capability are visible. Record reserves, international diplomacy, growing space capability and BRICS leadership have created a strong foundation.The next stage is to convert this foundation into employment, productivity, exports, private investment, innovation and income of the common citizen. If India succeeds in doing so, 2047 will not just be a celebration of a century of independence, but by that time India can become a decisive centre of the world economy, a major destination for global capital and an influential pillar of the multipolar world order. This is the biggest combined message of these four events — India is no longer just watching the global economy; it is preparing to shape its next chapter.

Railway Employee Allegedly Beaten in RPF Custody, Hands and Legs Fractured; Electric Shocks Administered to Genitals and Other Parts of Body

Bhubaneswar/Berhampur: The Railway Protection Force (RPF) in Berhampur has been accused of crossing all limits of inhumanity. A railway employee named Soumyaranjan Mishra was allegedly subjected to severe torture in RPF custody on suspicion of theft. It has been alleged that RPF personnel beat him, fracturing his hands and legs, and administered electric shocks to his genitals and various other parts of his body. In this regard, Siddhant Mishra, Coaching Depot Officer of East Coast Railway, Bhubaneswar, has written a letter to the Senior Divisional Security Commissioner of RPF, Khurda Road. He stated that CCTV footage showed that Soumyaranjan was not involved in the theft. Meanwhile, the East Coast Railway Contract Labour Union has lodged complaints with the Berhampur SP, Khurda DRM, East Coast Railway headquarters, various departments and the Commissionerate Police. The union has demanded an impartial investigation and justice, warning that it would launch an agitation if justice is not delivered.According to the letter from the Coaching Depot Officer and the union's complaint, Soumyaranjan, a resident of the Jayadev Vihar area of Bhubaneswar, works as a bedroll attendant on trains. On the 27th of last month, he was travelling to Bengaluru on duty aboard train No. 18463 Prashanti Express. Near Berhampur railway station, a bag belonging to a woman passenger travelling in seat No. 25 of coach A-1 was reportedly stolen. After learning about the incident,

Soumyaranjan informed the RPF.However, RPF personnel allegedly took him to Visakhapatnam, where they questioned and began torturing him. He was later brought to the Berhampur RPF police station and kept in custody. There, personnel in plain clothes and a uniformed police officer allegedly beat him and forced him to confess to the theft.When he refused, they allegedly subjected him to severe physical assault and electric shocks. He was subsequently admitted to Capital Hospital in Bhubaneswar in critical condition for treatment. Medical examinations reportedly revealed that his right hand and leg had been fractured. Although Soumyaranjan was discharged from the hospital after treatment, the union has alleged that his health condition remains serious. The union has demanded strict action against the police personnel allegedly responsible for torturing Soumyaranjan, reimbursement of his medical expenses and compensation. Union General Secretary Nabakishore Mahanty said that if their demands are not fulfilled, the union will take to the streets and launch an agitation. No response has been received from the Khurda DRM or the RPF Commissioner regarding the allegations.
