Bus Operations Stalled in Delhi – Cluster and Contract Drivers on Strike Since September 15; DTC Deploys Its Own Contract Drivers in Emergency Move

Not a permanent transfer, but a temporary arrangement; orders issued to join new depots immediately, with drivers deemed relieved from their old depots effective today – DTC drivers currently on conductor duty to take the wheel.

Crisis for public transport in the capital: Bus services in Delhi have come to a halt. Drivers of Cluster buses and DTC-contracted buses have been on strike or absent from work since September 15, 2026, causing a standstill in bus operations across several routes and subjecting the general public to immense inconvenience.

To address this shortage, the DTC management has implemented an emergency plan.

Key Points – What is the Government's 'Plan B'?

Point 1: Facts – What order has been issued? DTC management has issued an internal order:

- Who is being deployed: DTC's own contractual drivers are being immediately sent to depots

- How: Drivers named in the list are to be considered relieved from their old depots effective today and must join their newly assigned depots immediately.
- Double Duty: DTC drivers currently performing conductor duties will also be deployed to drive buses, provided they hold a valid driving license.

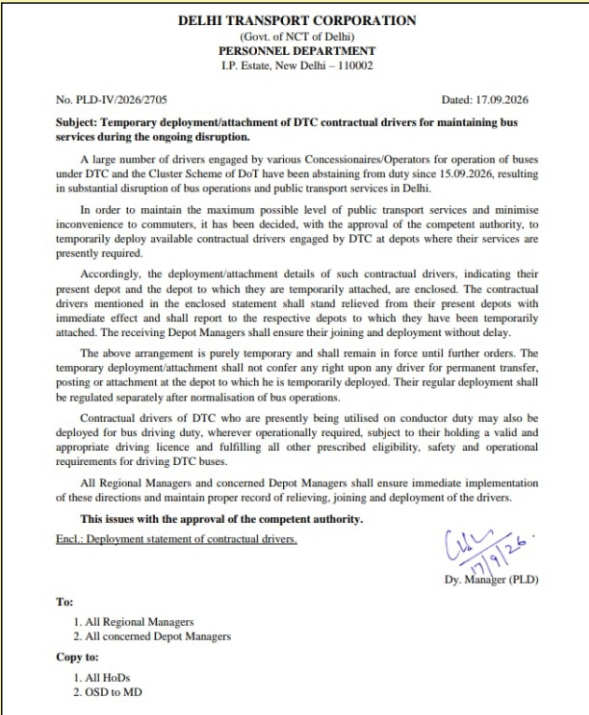
Point 2: Not a permanent arrangement – Important clarification by the administration:

- This is merely a temporary arrangement until the situation returns to normal.
- This will not entitle any driver to a permanent transfer.

- Once the situation normalizes, everyone will return to their original depots.
- Point 3: Analysis – What is the root cause? This crisis did not arise suddenly; there are three major reasons for it:

- Dual System: Delhi has a bifurcated system—on one hand, DTC's own employees, and on the other, the cluster/contract model (private operators paid ₹80–90 per km). The vast disparity in wages and benefits between the two groups is the root cause of the discontent.

- The ₹862 vs. ₹45,000 Conflict: Striking drivers are adamant about their demands: a daily wage of ₹862 with a schedule of 30 days of work and 4 days off,



while simultaneously seeking a monthly salary of ₹45,000. - Public Hardship: Lakhs of commuters—including school and college students and office-goers—have been forced to rely on autos and the metro, placing immense pressure on these alternative modes of transport.

Point 4: What Lies Ahead? – Questions of Public Interest • Can temporary drivers ensure the smooth operation of Delhi's entire bus service?

- Will the arrangement of converting conductors into drivers meet safety standards? (Verification of license validity is crucial.)

- To find a permanent solution, the government must engage in direct

dialogue with the contract drivers regarding the core issues: wages, medical benefits, and harassment.

Editorial Comment: While the transport standstill might be managed for a few days through temporary stop-gap measures, the wheels will only keep turning permanently if the drivers' basic needs are met. This emergency order by the DTC is merely crisis management, not a solution. The government must acknowledge that the driver working 30 days a month for ₹862 is the true backbone of Delhi's transport system. Only a formal notification addressing their demands will get Delhi's buses back on track.

Electric buses belong to private owners, operating at ₹80-90/km; drivers face pressure to mark 'Duty OK',

United strike without a union: All Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) employees have united to press for their demands.

The strike began on September 15 and continued into its third day today. Notably, the employees have not relied on any union this time; instead, they have united on their own to put forward their demands.

The employees state that they will not hold talks with any officials. They demand that the government led by Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta and Transport Minister Dr. Pankaj Kumar Singh hold a press conference to publicly accept their demands via the media and issue an official DTC notification; only then will they return to work.

What are the demands and allegations?

Point 1: Main demands – 4 major issues

DTC employees remain firm on strike for the third day – ₹862 daily wage

Demand for 30-day duty schedule and ₹45,000 monthly salary



- Salary hike: Currently receiving ₹862 per day (contingent on duty attendance); this should be increased to ₹45,000 per month.

- Medical and accident benefits: Guarantees regarding health safety and coverage for accidents occurring during duty.

- Leave: Employees do not get even four days off a month; they are required to work 30 days.

- Relief from damage charges and harassment: An end to the practice of recovering costs for bus damage from employees and a stop to harassment by officials while on duty.

Point 2: The Private Bus Racket – Allegations by Employees

- The electric buses plying on

Delhi's roads do not belong to the DTC; they are all owned by private operators.

- These buses are being operated by private entities at a rate of ₹80 to ₹90 per kilometer.

- Meanwhile, DTC drivers face the pressure of a heavy workload for low wages.

Point 3: Pressure to Mark 'Duty OK' – Public Inconvenience

The Drivers' Major Allegation: - Officials exert pressure on them to mark their status as 'Duty OK'.

- Due to this pressure, they are often forced to skip bus stops, causing immense inconvenience to the public in Delhi.

- Employees want this system of forced 'Duty OK' marking to

be abolished.

Editorial Comment: The DTC is Delhi's lifeline, yet its employees have been protesting on the streets for the past three days—and doing so without the backing of any union banner. Working 30 days a month without a day off for a daily wage of ₹862, contrasted with the ₹80–90/km payout to private buses—this disparity lies at the root of the strike.

The government must intervene immediately. If buses are skipping stops due to the pressure to mark 'Duty OK', it directly impacts passenger safety and convenience. The demand for a press conference and a written notification regarding the demands is justified to ensure that promises are not broken again.

Delhi Sitting on a Mountain of Garbage: Who is Accountable?

Why the rush to issue fines but delays in sanitation? 10 direct questions from the public to the MCD and the Delhi Government.

When the capital's citizens are forced to live amidst garbage, foul odors, and an unsanitary environment, the issue is not merely about filth; it is a matter of governance, public health, and accountability.

Claims are constantly made about transforming the national capital, Delhi, into a modern, clean, and livable city. Yet, in many areas, the reality facing citizens tells a different story: roadside garbage piles, mixed waste dumped in the open, foul odors, filthy drains, and stray animals roaming around trash heaps.

The question is not why garbage is generated in Delhi. The real question is: how effective is the system responsible for collecting waste, managing it scientifically, and ensuring a clean environment for citizens?

According to official Delhi Government documents, municipal bodies are responsible for solid waste management within their respective jurisdictions. For the MCD, this encompasses waste collection, management, and disposal. Given this clear mandate, it is natural to ask the MCD: if the responsibility is well-defined, why does the sanitation system still appear inconsistent and disorganized in many areas?



Direct questions from the public to the government: Politically, the "Triple Engine Government" narrative emphasizes better coordination between the Centre, the Delhi Government, and local bodies. However, for citizens, the true yardstick of any government's success is the quality of amenities found on their streets, in their lanes, at local markets, and right outside their homes.

If better coordination among these three levels is claimed, the public wants to know:

- Is the result of this coordination visible in the form of regular garbage collection, improved sanitation, scientific waste disposal, and the timely resolution of complaints?

- And if not, where does the accountability lie—with the government that formulates policies, the officials who oversee operations, or the contractors executing the work? While issuing fines is necessary, cleanliness is equally important; ensuring compliance with sanitation rules is a vital responsibility of the administration. Action must be taken against littering in public places, illegal dumping, and other violations. However, citizens ask: is the system responsible for enforcing these rules adhering to its own service standards with equal seriousness?

If a citizen or shopkeeper is fined for littering, the system itself must also be asked:

- Is there a system for regular garbage collection in the area? Are adequate dustbins and designated collection points available?
- Is the street cleaned again after the garbage is collected?

Delhi's Real Picture: Garbage Everywhere, For How Long?



- Are complaints resolved in a timely manner?

- Is action taken against negligent officials and contractors as well? Merely issuing fines does not clean the city; the sanitation system itself must be made accountable.

From collection to disposal—where is the system failing? Solid waste management is not just about picking up trash from the streets; it encompasses all stages: collection from homes and shops, segregation, transportation, processing, recycling, and final disposal.

Delhi's Economic Survey (2025–26) reports that approximately 11,500 tonnes of municipal solid waste are generated daily in the MCD area, with an average segregation rate at the source of about 59 percent. The survey also sets future targets for segregation.

This figure raises a crucial question:

- Given the massive volume of waste, are the capacities for collection, segregation, and processing commensurate with it?
- If a system for collecting wet and dry

waste separately exists on paper but the waste gets mixed again after collection, the very purpose of the cooperation expected from citizens is undermined. Mountains of Waste: Old Problems, New Deadlines.

The Bhalswa, Ghazipur, and Okhla landfills epitomize Delhi's long-standing waste management challenge. Work on the scientific processing and bio-mining of legacy waste is currently underway. The MCD's official eSBM portal provides a system to monitor these activities, vehicle movements, and bio-mining reports.

However, the question remains: what is the permanent solution to the problem of fresh waste accumulation alongside the removal of legacy waste? A central government review in July 2026 discussed the progress of bio-mining and scientific processing at all three landfills sites. Meanwhile, an August 2026 report highlighted that the pace of bio-mining had been hampered by rainfall.

This makes it clear that while clearing landfills is crucial, the scientific management of fresh waste generated daily is equally important.

Who is responsible for public health? Garbage heaps do not merely mar the city's aesthetics. Long-term waste accumulation can exacerbate issues such as foul odors, pest infestations, the presence of stray animals, clogged drains, and waterlogging. Open burning of waste also poses a risk of air pollution.

According to the Delhi Government's Environment Department, the responsibility for solid waste management lies with the Urban Development Department and local civic bodies. The department's citizen charter emphasizes waste segregation, decentralized management, and public awareness.

So, the question arises: if garbage lies uncollected in an area for days, who bears the immediate responsibility for safeguarding the health of the children, elderly, and ordinary citizens living there?

Is it merely up to the citizens to exercise caution Is it enough to simply advise people on how to handle waste, or must the administration also ensure that waste is not allowed to accumulate in the first place?

Sanitation workers are the backbone of the system—but who will provide oversight? The success of the sanitation system depends on the concerted efforts of workers, vehicles, equipment, contractors, and officials. If a ward faces a shortage of staff, a lack of vehicles, faulty equipment, or lax supervision of contractors, the public bears the direct consequences.

Therefore, the issue is not about blaming the sanitation workers, but rather...

Health Insurance Claim Cannot Be Rejected Solely for Non-Hospitalisation: Karnataka High Court - Important Judgement

The Karnataka High Court has ruled that rejecting a genuine insurance claim merely because the patient did not stay in the hospital for 24 hours as an in-patient (Hospitalisation) would defeat the very purpose of insurance.

Case Details Case Name: M/s National Insurance Co. Ltd. & Anr. v. Mr. Padmanabha Shetty G & Others Court / Judge: Karnataka High Court | Justice Suraj Govindaraj Judgement Date: September 1, 2026 Background of the Case

Petitioner / Insured: Mr. Padmanabha Shetty is a retired officer of Vijaya Bank (later merged with Bank of Baroda). He was covered under the Group Medical Insurance Scheme for retired employees of Indian Banks Association (IBA) for a sum of Rs. 9,00,000. Disease and Treatment: He was

diagnosed with Stage IV Carcinoma of the Prostate and underwent chemotherapy at HCG Hospital, Bengaluru.

To prevent the cancer from spreading to bones and as a continuation of treatment, doctors prescribed two special injections, Zoladex and Xgeva, once every three months.

Insurance Company Denial: The National Insurance Company paid for 4 instances where he was hospitalised. But it refused to reimburse Rs. 2,85,470 for these two injections, stating: "These injections were administered on an Outpatient (OPD) basis; there was no 24-hour Hospitalisation or Day Care Treatment requiring anaesthesia."

Order of Permanent Lok Adalat: Aggrieved by the rejection, Padmanabha Shetty approached the Permanent Lok Adalat in Mangaluru. On September 20, 2023, the Lok Adalat ruled in favour of Shetty: - The claimed amount of Rs. 2,85,470 should be

paid with 6% annual interest. - Compensation of Rs. 25,000 should be paid. - The entire liability lies with the insurance company.

Challenging this, National Insurance Company filed a Writ Petition in the Karnataka High Court. Key Observations of High Court

1. Hospitalisation is a means of treatment, not the goal itself: Justice Suraj Govindaraj categorically stated in his order, "Hospitalisation is only one of the many modes of delivering treatment; it is not the ultimate goal itself." Due to modern advancements in medicine, many drugs are administered via injection without hospital admission. When intensive treatment for a disease continues, denying insurance solely because the patient was not admitted to a hospital bed would undermine the basic purpose of the medical insurance policy.

2. Argument regarding Conciliation rejected: The insurance company argued that the Permanent Lok Adalat passed an order directly without holding conciliation talks. However, during the High Court hearing, when asked if it was ready to offer any settlement amount, the company refused, saying "We cannot pay even one rupee." Hence, the court rejected that argument, stating that sending the case back for conciliation would only be a waste of time.

Final Judgement Petition Dismissed: The High Court fully dismissed the insurance company's writ petition and confirmed the order of the Lok Adalat.

Costs: For harassing a retired senior citizen, a cost of Rs. 50,000 was imposed on the insurance company and ordered to be paid to the petitioner Padmanabha Shetty.

Deadline: The High Court ordered National Insurance Company to pay the amount ordered by the Lok Adalat (with 6% interest), the compensation, and the court costs, all within 30 days of receiving the order. Summary: Even if you don't get admitted for 24 hours, if the injection / treatment is part of continued cancer / major treatment and prescribed by doctor, insurance MUST pay. This judgement helps all senior citizens with Health insurance

Financial burden despite Ayushman — The middle class is quietly being drained of funds

Illness of the body, punishment for the pocket — The hidden profiteering in medical supplies

- **Editorial Introduction:** A person arrives at the hospital with an illness but often leaves with a massive bill. The most expensive part of treatment isn't always the medication or the surgery; sometimes, a plastic tube costing just a few rupees hits the pocket the hardest. This is not merely a business issue; it is a crisis of trust.

- What the facts say – The Tukaram Mundhe Report: The survey report submitted to the Central Government by Tukaram Mundhe, Commissioner of the Maharashtra Food and Drug Administration (FDA), reveals a bitter truth.

- IV Infusion Set: Trade price ₹11.05, Printed MRP ₹325 – MarkUp of 2,841%
- Syringe: Purchase price ₹6.75, MRP ₹57.20
- Catheter: Purchase price ₹29.41, MRP ₹310
- Others: Nebulizer mask kit (purchase price ₹40–₹45, MRP ₹650–₹715, i.e., a 1300–1600% margin); IV cannula extension line (₹22.50 vs. ₹424)

Mundhe states clearly: "The most expensive component of the hospital bill may never even reach the hospital itself. The patient remains unaware of whether the price reflects the actual cost or a markup determined long before the item reached the ward." This report by MSPMRU covered four categories: IV sets, syringes/needles, nebulizer/oxygen masks, and other consumables.

- Key Points – Where does the pricing game begin?

a) MRP fixed early, burden falls later: According to Munde, the MRP is often determined at the manufacturer-distributor level before the product even reaches the hospital. By the time the patient sees the final page of the bill, the game has already played out.

b) Prisoners, not customers: In the open market, a customer has choices. A patient lying in a hospital bed has no choice. They cannot simply say, "This syringe is too expensive; I'll buy it from outside." Munde himself wrote, "These are not elective purchases. Patients cannot compare prices."

c) The industry acknowledges this too: The Association of Indian Medical Device Industry (AiMeD) has stated that patients cannot bargain, and ethical manufacturers are forced to either play within this flawed system or exit the market. They have demanded a cap on trade margins at 4 to 6 times the ex-factory price.

- Patient Rights – Not a privilege, but an entitlement

1. Right to Information: Under the Consumer Protection Act 2019, a patient has the right to know the actual price of services and goods.

2. Right to Transparency in Billing: Under the Clinical Establishments Act, every hospital is

required to provide a separate itemized breakdown in the bill.

3. Right to Choice: Patients cannot be prevented from purchasing medicines or consumables from outside sources.

4. Judicial Rulings and Government Action

- Supreme Court Stance – March 4, 2025: A bench led by Justice Surya Kant directed all states to formulate guidelines preventing private hospitals from forcing patients to buy medicines, implants, and consumables from their own pharmacies at inflated prices. The Court stated, "States need to protect patients from being fleeced." The Court also affirmed that healthcare is an integral part of Article 21—the Right to Life. Actions by NPPA and the Centre:

- Currently, only four medical devices—coronary stents, drug-eluting stents, condoms, and IUCDs—fall under the price cap within the scheduled category.

- Trade margin rationalization was previously implemented for pulse oximeters, blood pressure (BP) machines, nebulizers, and thermometers during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Following the Munde report, the Centre has now ordered the NPPA to conduct an investigation; the Department of Pharmaceuticals will review the report.

- A parliamentary panel has recommended enacting permanent legislation to cap trade margins—similar to the 30% cap on 42 cancer drugs—at 30% generally and 70% for certain devices; such measures previously resulted in annual savings of ₹1,984 crore.

- Legal Framework:
 - DPCO 2013 (Paragraphs 4 and 20): The government has the authority to bring any essential medicine or device under price control and restrict annual MRP increases to a maximum of 10%.

- Drugs and Cosmetics Act: While 28 categories of medical devices are classified as "drugs," they are not subject to price control—this constitutes a "structural regulatory gap."6. What should be demanded – Editorial recommendations

1. Permanent trade margin cap: A maximum of 75% for consumables priced below ₹1,000; 66% for those between ₹1,000 and ₹1 lakh; and 50% for those above ₹1 lakh—as proposed by AiMeD.

2. Dual pricing bill: The bill must clearly display three figures: the procurement price, the MRP, and the actual amount charged to the patient.

3. Amendment to DPCO: Essential consumables—such as IV sets, syringes, catheters, and oxygen masks—should be included in the National List of Essential Medicines (NLEM) under Section 4.

4. State-level guidelines: In accordance with the Supreme Court's order, every state's FDA should be empowered to audit hospital bills.

A final question: Hospitals are entitled to recover costs and earn a reasonable profit, but there are limits to profit. When an item costing ₹11.05 is sold for ₹325, it is not profit—it is profiteering from helplessness. Healthcare should be defined by transparency and integrity, not by expensive machinery. Otherwise, the question remains: the illness afflicted the body, so why was the pocketbook punished?

Held at the government hospital in collaboration with the 'Smart' organization, the camp informed attendees about the importance of BMD (Bone Mineral Density) testing.

Key Highlights – What happened at the event?

Point 1: What did the doctor say?

- During the program, Dr. Pawan explained that a balanced and nutritious diet is essential for a healthy life.

- Good health is maintained only when the body receives necessary nutrients.

- BMD testing assesses bone mineral density, helping to detect early signs of bone weakness and osteoporosis.

- The direct link between nutrition and bone strength was explained to the participants.

Point 2: Four Mantras for a Healthy Lifestyle – The program emphasized four key factors for healthy living: A balanced diet and intake of essential nutrients (Calcium, Vitamin D)



- Regular physical activity and exercise.

- Periodic health check-ups, especially BMD testing for those over 35
- Avoiding junk food and getting regular exposure to sunlight

Point 3: Community Radio Amplifies the Message

- The team from 'Salaam Namaste Community Radio 90.4 FM' (IMS Noida) was present at the venue.

- In addition to covering the event's activities, the team recorded messages related to health and nutrition.

- Efforts will be made to compile information regarding BMD testing, nutrition, and bone health, and to

disseminate it to the widest possible audience through community radio.

Editorial Note: 'Nutrition Month' (Poshan Maah) often tends to focus solely on malnutrition among children and women; however, this initiative serves as a reminder that nutrition is also essential for strong bone health. With bone weakness rapidly increasing in India—particularly among women over the age of 40—raising awareness about tests like BMD in government hospitals exemplifies the principle that "prevention is better than cure." The message of "Good Health, Many Benefits" will only truly resonate if we make proper nutrition a habit.

• **Destruction of Sins and Liberation (Moksha):** As stated in the Brahma Vaivarta Purana, observing the Radha Ashtami fast and chanting Radha's name destroys al lphysical, verbal, and mental sins, granting a place at the divine feet (liberation) after death.

• **Peace, Prosperity, and Eternal Marital Bliss:** Women who observe a waterless or fruit - based fast and worship Radha Rani are blessed with lifelong marital harmony, the joy of children, and enduring peace and love in household life.

• **Attainment of Eight Siddhis:** By Her divine grace, one never faces a shortage of wealth, food, or prosperity, as She is the supreme energy of Lord Krishna Himself.

• **Appearance of Radha Rani:** According to scriptures, Mother Radha made Her divine appearance on this holy day in the village of Barsana (or Rawal) in Uttar Pradesh, as the daughter of King Vrishbhanu and Mother Kirti.

Main Rituals and Fasting Procedure

1. Morning Bath and Vow (Sankalpa): Take a bath before sunrise, wear clean clothes(preferably yellow or red), and take a solemn vow (Sankalpa) for the Radha Ashtamifast.

2. Decoration of the Altar: Clean the home temple and spread a red or yellow cloth ona raised wooden platform. Install the idol or picture of Radha-Krishna on it.



3. Panchamrit Bath and Adornment: Perform the ritual bath (Abhishekam) of thedeities with Panchamrit (milk, curd, ghee, honey, and holy Ganga water), followed bypure water. Adorn Them with beautiful new attire, jewelry, and fresh flowers(especially lotus and marigold).

4. Tilak: Apply Roli (vermilion), Kumkum, and sandalwood paste to Radha Rani.

Offerings (Bhog) and Special Delicacies

• **Special Offering:** Offering Arbi (taro root) curry and Puri is considered highly auspicious and essential on Radha Ashtami.

• **Sweets:** Offer Malpua, Kheer, Makhan-Mishri (butter and sugar candy), and Panchamrit.

• **Tulsi Leaves:** Place Tulsi (holy basil) leaves in Lord Krishna's offering. Note that Tulsi is not offered directly to Radha Rani; it is placed at Krishna's feet or in His direct offering.

Auspicious Time and Aarti

• **Midday Worship:** As Radha Rani's appearance is believed to have occurred at noon, the main puja and Aarti are performed during midday (between 11:00 AM and 1:30PM).

• **Story and Chanting:** Listen to the Radha Ashtami fast story (Vrat Katha), recite the Radha Chalisa or Radha Sahasranama, and conclude with the Radha -Krishna Aarti.

Grand Celebrations in Mathura and Barsana

• **Mahabhishekam:** At 4:00 AM, a divine grand bath (Mahabhishekam) using milk, curd, and sacred herbs is performed at the Shriji Temple in Barsana and major temples in Vrindavan.

• **Sankirtan and Chants:** The air reverberates with "Radhe - Radhe" chants, devotional songs (Pada Gayan), and congratulatory hymns (Badhai Geet) throughout the day.

• **Holy Darshan of Her Feet:** Only on this sacred day of the year do devotees get the blessed opportunity to view the holy feet (Charan Darshan) of Radha Rani at the Shriji Temple in Barsana.

Worship Rituals and Traditions

- Special worship ceremonies are organized on this day in offices, factories, workshops, and construction sites. The entire premises are decorated with flowers and traditional festoons (bandanwars).

- Idols of Lord Vishwakarma are installed in decorated pandals (marquees) and worshipped according to prescribed rituals.

- Workers worship their tools, machines, and instruments, refraining from using them on this day. This practice is observed as a prayer for success and safety.

The Legend of Vishwakarma Puja – In Brief

According to mythology, once, when wicked demons were destroying the Yagyas (sacrificial rituals) performed by sages, the sages approached Lord Brahma. Brahma advised them to visit Sage Angira—the son of Agni Dev (the Fire God) and a devout follower of Lord Vishwakarma. Sage Angira suggested a remedy: on the day of Amavasya (the new moon), one should suspend all worldly activities and, with a spirit of devotion, listen to the story of Shri Vishwakarma and worship Him. The sages followed this advice; consequently, all the demons were reduced to ashes, and the yagnas were completed without any obstacles. For 'Babba Ki Chaupal' Palaces for politics, rented rooms for the future?

7,000 beds for 3.5 lakh students in the 'Vishwa Guru's' capital, while gleaming party offices stand in 290 districts

This question is not about any specific political party; it is about the nation's priorities. When the country's future — its students — comes to the capital to study, why can't they find a roof over their heads?Every year, approximately 3.5 lakh students from across the country arrive in the national capital. Some harbor dreams of becoming IAS officers, while others aspire to be doctors, engineers, teachers, or researchers.The question is straightforward: how many government hostel beds are available for these 3.5 lakh students who represent the nation's future? The answer boils down to a mere 7,000 beds.For the rest, there is only one option: find a 'PG' (paying guest accommodation), pay exorbitant rent, make compromises, and somehow complete their studies. This is not a one-off story; the situation has remained unchanged for the past twelve years.Reflecting on this plight, Natthu Kaka asks at 'Babba Ki Chaupal': "In such a vast country, why is it so difficult to provide a safe roof for those who are building the future?"Facts – Two pictures, one truth:Picture One: The reality for students

Students arriving in the capital: Approx. 3.5 lakh
Government hostel capacity: Approx. 7,000
Result: 98% of students depend on private PGs, high rents, and unsafe, dilapidated buildings.

Picture Two: The glitter of party offices
Party offices completed in 290 districts
Land acquired for offices in 123 districts
115 offices under construction
The system swings into action rapidly — land, buildings, and budgets are all readily available.

This comparison is not an accusation; it is a mirror held up to reality.Analysis – In 3 points:1. A

dilapidated building is more than just bricks and mortar: When children live in a dilapidated hostel, it is not merely the walls that surround them. That structure holds a mother's hope, a father's hard-earned money, and a family's entire dream. When that wall collapses, it is not just bricks that get buried in the rubble; the future of a household is buried along with them. Then files move, inquiries are ordered, tributes are paid, and eventually, everything falls silent. Kaka’s question is valid: if everyone can see the age of a dilapidated building, why can’t they see the age of the children living inside it?2. Three engines, yet the train of education has derailed: They speak of a "triple-engine government." Chaupal fails to understand where these three engines are headed. If these three engines can join forces to erect magnificent party offices, networks, and palatial headquarters in every district, why can’t they establish good colleges, hostels, libraries, laboratories, and research facilities in those same districts?3. The public seeks opportunity, not palaces: The people aren't asking for palaces. They simply want their children to be educated, safe, and treated with dignity. They want higher education facilities within their own districts so that their children don't have to travel hundreds of kilometers to the capital, searching for a future while living in cramped PG rooms.Conclusion – Chaupal’s final question: Governments change, slogans change, and announcements change, but the student's problem remains the same: the need for a room, a hostel, a good college, and a secure future.Party office buildings may expand the reach of power, but it is schools, universities, and hostels that shape the nation's future. Therefore, before taking pride in the number of offices, consider the number of children who have set out to build the nation's future without even a safe roof over their heads.In the end, Natthu Kaka simply asks: "Politics has found a home in the capital of the 'Vishwa-Guru' (World Teacher)—but when will the students find a roof over their heads?"If the answer to this, too, is to be found only in the next century, then Chaupal will ask: "In which century, exactly, will the public's turn finally come?"

Job salary and duty accountability (Context: Salary drawn by an MLA's niece without working)With a government position comes responsibility: A salary is not just a right, but tied to the oath of duty. Six months away from duty, yet the salary continued; When questions arose, the office atmosphere grew tense.

Pursuing a PG degree and performing job duties— Balancing both requires strict adherence to rules. Whether through recommendations or kinship, the law applies to all: Holding a government post demands integrity toward one's duty.

The 70,000 salary comprises public money; Behind every rupee lies someone's trust. If an inquiry is underway, let the truth come to light: Let the rules determine who is guilty and who is innocent.

Editorial Analysis of the Poem: This poem is not an attack on a specific individual, but a critique of a prevailing trend. The poet has narrated the entire story in four simple points.

Essence of Lines 9–12: This is the strongest part of the poem. The poet describes the sum of 70,000 not merely as a figure, but as the 'public's trust.' Ultimately, the poet declines to act as judge—let the investigation proceed, and let the rules speak for themselves. That is the beauty of democracy.

Our demands are clear: • Files regarding attendance registers, leave approvals, and salary payments should be subjected to public scrutiny. • If study leave was sanctioned, the documents must be produced; if not, recovery of funds and accountability must be ensured.In government service, one should function based on one's oath of office, not on recommendations or influence.

Editorial Note: A government job is not a gift; it is a responsibility. Occupying a position comes with an oath of duty.

The recent case raises questions regarding this very oath. It is alleged that the niece of a public representative did not report for duty for approximately six months, yet her monthly salary of 70,000 continued to be disbursed regularly. The reason cited is her postgraduate (PG) studies.The issue is not about influence, but about the system itself. If an ordinary employee remains absent without notice for even six days, actions ranging from show-cause notices and salary

deductions to termination of service are taken. How, then, did the rules become so flexible in this specific instance?

Every rupee in the government treasury comes from public taxes. The primary claim to these funds belongs to the faithful discharge of duty, not to personal relationships.

Now that the matter of an investigation has arisen, it is essential that the truth be fully revealed. This case is not just about an individual; it concerns a mindset that views a government position as a source of personal privilege.

Local action sluggish on land-related complaint sent to PM; calls for independent probe intensify

Matter has been 'under process' since September 10; complaint linked to Bonai SDM office seeks a halt to compensation payments and action against the guilty.

Questions are being raised regarding the slow pace of local action following a complaint—submitted to the Prime Minister's Office—alleging undue financial gain through land purchases made using insider information about a government project. The complainant has demanded a high-level, time-bound investigation into the matter.

Key Points: • Subject of Complaint: Allegations of purchasing land at low prices within the project area by allegedly misusing confidential information related to a government project. • Complainant's Demands: An independent, impartial, and document-based inquiry; a stay on compensation payments pending the investigation's outcome; and action under the Prevention of Corruption Act if irregularities are found. • Current Status: The complaint status is marked as 'under process' as of September 10, 2026, and the matter pertains to the Bonai Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) office. • Sequence of Events: Following an initial complaint filed on August 6, the complainant, Rajkumar Yadav, has submitted a fresh application to the Prime Minister requesting a probe by a competent central or state investigative agency.



Detailed Report: According to available information, the petition alleges that if any government official or employee purchased land—or facilitated benefits for others—by misusing their position or confidential information, it constitutes a serious administrative irregularity. The complainant maintains that immediate legal steps are essential to protect the interests of the original and genuine landowners. He has demanded a review of actions such as compensation payments for the land in question until the investigation concludes, ensuring that no one derives undue financial benefit from the alleged irregularities. The complainant alleges that despite the matter being forwarded from central government offices to the district administration, the local revenue machinery is failing to show the expected urgency. They maintain that even if the allegations are baseless, an impartial inquiry should clarify the situation. Administrative Perspective: According to Odisha government records, the office of the Sub-Collector, Bonai, is a key unit of the district administration, with responsibilities that include overseeing office operations. However, the official stance of the concerned officials and the final outcome of the inquiry are yet to be determined. Editorial Note: The available material regarding the complaint does not substantiate the allegations. This report is based on the issues raised in the complaint and the administrative context. Only an impartial and time-bound inquiry can clarify the actual situation.

Flights to Resume from Bhubaneswar to Bangkok; IndiGo Opens Bookings from October 2

Bhubaneswar : International flight services will resume from Bhubaneswar in October. Flights will once again operate from Bhubaneswar to Bangkok, bringing back international air connectivity that had remained suspended.

IndiGo has started accepting bookings for Bangkok from October 2. To ensure that international flight services are not disrupted in the future, the airport authorities are planning to introduce a hub-and-spoke service. This will enable international flights to connect passengers to multiple destinations.

Earlier, flights from Bhubaneswar to Bangkok, Singapore and Abu Dhabi operated twice a week. However, some airlines subsequently cancelled their services due to a decline in passenger numbers and rising aviation fuel prices. As a result, passengers travelling to and from Odisha had to depend on other airports. With the introduction of the hub-and-spoke service, flights will



operate via other cities. However, passengers will no longer face difficulties related to baggage handling and boarding. This will also facilitate connectivity to more international destinations, said the Director of Bhubaneswar Airport.

Around 5.1 million passengers travel through Bhubaneswar Airport every year, making it the 13th busiest airport in the country. To make passenger services more attractive and convenient, the Passenger Service 2026 programme will also be organised for one month. Special facilities will be provided for passengers with disabilities and senior citizens. Special programmes will also be conducted to promote Odisha's culture and folk art. In addition, areas such as cleanliness, security and parking will receive special attention.

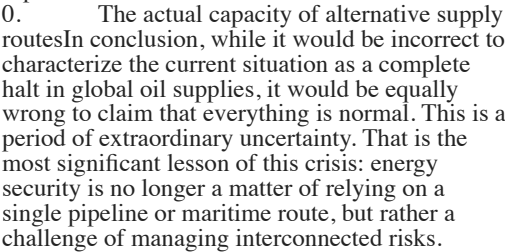

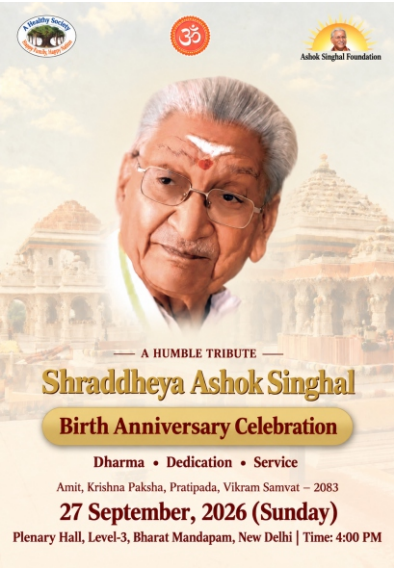
found in the preliminary verification is being thrust upon the public.

While discussions on road safety often focus on driver error, speeding, and alcohol consumption, the driver's health is frequently overlooked. Conditions such as fainting due to low blood sugar or impaired night vision caused by weak eyesight are equally significant causes of accidents.

To accord respect to drivers, their health must be prioritized. This initiative by the Delhi Taxi Association could serve as a model for other states and transport unions.

Ranchi, Jharkhand: Another landslide occurred in Dhanbad. On Saturday afternoon, the ground caved in with a loud noise in the Kamini Kalyan Basti, located near the closed Jharia RSP College in the Bastakola area. This caused cracks in about a dozen houses. The incident created panic and panic throughout the settlement. Following this incident, people fled their homes and ran for safety.

The landslide was so severe that underground pipelines in several homes were ruptured, completely disrupting the water supply to the settlement. A full technical team from Mines Rescue has also arrived at the scene and begun an investigation. Angered by the incident, people gathered on the Jharia-Dhanbad main road and began a massive protest. They stood in the middle of the road, completely blocking traffic. This resulted in long queues of vehicles on the main road. Mayor Sanjeev Singh was the first to arrive. He directed BCCL officials to immediately reach the scene and begin relief work on a war footing.

Bastakola GM SK Gaikwad and Rajapur Project Officer M Kundu arrived shortly thereafter. The officials inspected the affected area and spoke with the victims. Sindri DSP Prakash Chand Mahato was present at the scene with his team. Officials and public representatives managed to calm the angry people by persuading them and assuring them of appropriate action.



Mayor Sanjeev Singh met with the affected families and assured them of all possible assistance. He said that all affected people would be resettled in safe locations. As an immediate relief measure, the Mayor arranged for the families of Ashish Rawani, Niranjan Rawani, Baby Devi, and Vishwajit Dey to spend the night at the GM office located at the Bastakola Rescue School.

BRICS: Hopes Amidst Contradictions

The 18th BRICS Summit, held in New Delhi on September 12–13, 2026, produced a 140-point declaration that simultaneously highlights the aspirations of the Global South and exposes the group's internal contradictions. The task for the Left is neither to simply praise nor to dismiss it, but to read the document critically—identifying where it advances the struggle against US-led unipolarity, where it falters, and where the Indian government's conduct betrays the spirit of the declaration.BRICS is not an anti-imperialist platform. It is a forum that strengthens multipolarity against the US project of unipolarity. This distinction matters. The group comprises nations with vastly different fundamental social systems: China has a socialism-oriented economic system; Russia has oligarchic capitalism; and India is a capitalist-landlord state led by big capital, now ruled by corporate-communal Hindutva forces. Naturally, the diversity increases further when considering the other member states. Consequently, they are not allies in a shared anti-imperialist struggle; rather, they are all striving to carve out space for themselves within a non-democratic, dollar-dominated, US-centric international order.This limitation is inherent. It explains why the declaration condemns coercive unilateral measures without explicitly naming the US. It also explains why it calls for maximum restraint in West Asia without identifying Israel as the aggressor. The declaration's silence is not a sudden, accidental occurrence; it is the price of consensus among nations with diverse alliances and class interests.Regarding



political clout versus economic strength: BRICS nations collectively account for more than half the world's population and hold a share of approximately one-third of global GDP. Their economic influence is immense; however, they lack commensurate political influence in international institutions such as the United Nations, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), and the World Bank. This is a weakness that the declaration addresses.The declaration calls for reform of the UN Security Council, where only China and Russia—among the BRICS group—hold permanent membership. The declaration deserves praise for noting that no woman has ever been elected as UN Secretary-General. With the election of a new Secretary-General due soon, this matter requires immediate attention. Furthermore, the woman selected for this role should be someone who represents and champions the interests of the Global South. This is crucial because, to date, only one individual each from Latin America and the Caribbean, and two

declaration does not challenge the dollar's status as the reserve currency, the IMF's structural adjustment conditions, or the debt structure that keeps the Global South in perpetual subjugation. Initiatives like the BRICS Contingent Reserve Arrangement and the BRICS Multilateral Guarantee Initiative represent steps toward financial resilience, yet they are very modest measures. Proposals such as the BRICS Grain Exchange and the Agricultural Inputs, Genetic Resources, and Information (AGRIIN) network address food security issues but do so without confronting the corporate agribusiness monopolies that dominate the global food system.Poverty, healthcare, unemployment, debt, and artificial intelligence—these are all challenges facing the Global South. BRICS nations also grapple with these issues, with the possible exception of China, which has lifted hundreds of millions out of poverty and developed indigenous technological capabilities. The declaration acknowledges these challenges: it commits to the 2030 Agenda (Sustainable Development Goals), identifies inequality as the root cause of most of these challenges, and takes note of proposals from an international panel on inequality. It addresses issues such as AI governance, digital public infrastructure, health cooperation, tuberculosis (TB), food security, and disaster preparedness.However, identifying the issues Merely acquiring them is not the solution. These challenges can only be met by standing up against American imperialism and its aggression, and by refusing to accept the terms of a global order designed to extract surplus from the periphery and concentrate it at the center. A manifesto calling for greater access to AI resources and international cooperation for the Global South is meaningless as long as... [those resources remain] controlled by American corporations.

Drone incident near a holy Saudi city and visa cancellations in the UAE: Facts and misconceptions

Thousands of Bangladeshi and Pakistani visas cancelled in the UAE; drone incident near Mecca sparks debate on Gulf security

Dhaka claims 4,800 citizens are stranded, while Abu Dhabi states the issue is not limited to any single country; meanwhile, Saudi Arabia claims to have shot down a Houthi drone south of Mecca.

New Delhi. Two separate incidents in the Gulf region have raised concerns among the South Asian expatriate community and the Muslim world. On one hand, there are reports of the sudden cancellation of residency visas for thousands of Bangladeshi and Pakistani citizens in the UAE; on the other, Saudi Arabia has claimed to have shot down a Houthi drone south of Mecca.What are the facts?• UAE Visa Issue: According to the Bangladeshi newspaper 'The Daily Star' and Indian media reports, the visas of approximately 4,000 to 4,800 Bangladeshi citizens have been cancelled. Many individuals received notification via email or text message after returning home for a holiday. • Official Stance of the Bangladesh Government: In July 2026, the State Minister for Foreign Affairs stated that 626 cases had been officially confirmed and that this action was not limited to Bangladesh alone. Citizens from other countries—including Pakistan, Egypt, the Philippines, and Nepal—have also been affected. • Possible Reasons: The UAE has not disclosed an official reason. Experts on expatriate affairs suggest that heightened security checks, lapses in documentation or renewals, and scrutiny of social media activities could be potential causes, though there is no direct confirmation of this. • Expatriate Population: Approximately 1.2 million Bangladeshis reside in the UAE, making them the third-largest expatriate community after Indians and Pakistanis. • Incident near Mecca: On September 15–16, 2026, the Saudi-led coalition claimed its air defenses destroyed a Houthi drone south of Mecca before it could enter restricted airspace. A Saudi spokesperson described the security of the holy sites as a "red line." • Houthi denial: Houthi spokespersons dismissed claims that Mecca was targeted, stating instead that their attacks were directed at oil facilities and military bases. • International reaction: Pakistan, Turkey, Bangladesh, the Maldives, the UAE, and the OIC have condemned the incident.Key points for editorial analysis: 0. The visa crisis is a humanitarian and economic issue, not a diplomatic conspiracy: Thousands of workers and small business owners who have been in the UAE for years have suddenly found themselves unemployed. This has a direct impact on their families and on remittances. Linking this to India-Pakistan-Bangladesh diplomacy is factually incorrect. 0. Adherence to the law is the best safeguard: The Bangladeshi government itself has urged its citizens to respect the host country's laws, specifically advising them to refrain from making political comments on social media. 0. It is not a question of Mecca's security, but an escalation of regional conflict: Saudi Arabia claims this is the second time since 2017 that Mecca has been targeted. This incident is part of the Yemen conflict and rising tensions in the Red Sea, not evidence of negligence regarding the faith by the Saudi leadership. 0. Avoid conflating the two incidents: The UAE visa issue is an administrative matter, whereas the drone incident near Mecca is a security issue. Linking the two to make comments about "MBS's power" or claiming "Mecca is unsafe" fails to meet factual journalistic standards.Conclusion: It would be more credible for newspapers to present this subject as two separate, verified news stories rather than sensationalizing it. On one hand, there is a need for diplomatic efforts to rehabilitate migrant workers; on the other, there is a call to reduce regional tensions to ensure the security of the holy cities.
